Our 'Support-a-reader' program will hopefully start again soon. It is important that your child reads every night to gain fluency.

Class Rules

Our rules reflect the Cervantes Primary School's Behaviour Expectations. Students in our class are active participants in choosing the rules to ensure we have a productive learning environment. These rules link closely to our school values.

Behaviour Management

Each student has their own peg which will be placed on the traffic light chart. When students are on the green light at the end of the day because they have demonstrated good behaviour they receive a faction tick on their chart.

Poor behaviour choices result in students moving their peg down the traffic light chart. This clearly shows students how close they are to losing Golden Time as they have a visual warning. Once they are on the red light they lose their first 5 minutes. Continued poor choices result in further Golden Time losses. Students are given ample opportunity to work their way back up the traffic light chart.

Students will also earn stickers for showing improvement in learning and demonstrating our school values. Each time the students earn 10 stickers they receive a reward.

Yellow slips will be sent home if a student loses Golden Time or if they have time out in the playground. These slips need to be signed and returned to school the next day.

Keeping Healthy

Please remember to have healthy options in lunch boxes. We need to be allergy aware as we have students and staff at school with food allergies.

We have 'Crunch n Sip' in the afternoon and students are able to have a fruit, or vegetable snack. Please ensure food is pre-cut for students where necessary.

We ask that you check regularly for head lice. If your child has nits please treat diligently and inform the school so we can check other students. Mrs Dennis does regular head lice checks according to our school policy.
