Behaviour Management

The Senior Class will be using the traffic light system.

- All students start on green.
- A verbal warning will first be given if a student displays negative behaviours. If these behaviours continue they will be given a formal warning and their peg will be moved to the orange light. This is a 'think about your actions' step.
- If the negative behaviours continue further, their peg will be moved to red and a Yellow Slip will be sent home to advise the parents/guardian. At this stage students will miss out on 5 minutes of Golden Time on Friday and be required to sit on the veranda for 5 minutes during the lunch break.

In class we use group points and raffle tickets for positive behaviours and a whole class token system. Rewards are decided by the class and they are looking forward to earning the Escape Room reward..

Whole school rewards include Faction Points, Golden Time, end of term rewards and raffle tickets for a treasure chest prize.

At the end of each day, students who have attended and retained 30 minutes of Golden Time receive a faction point.

Students may be asked to complete work at break times if they are displaying off-task behaviours and failing to complete tasks. If this happens on a regular basis, parents/guardian will be notified and they will miss out on the End of Term Class Reward

Keeping Healthy

Good personal hygiene is important at this age, please ensure your child is maintaining a high level of cleanliness.

Please remember that lollies, chocolates, chips and cooldrink are not permitted at school.

We have 'Crunch 'n Sip' in the afternoon and students are able to bring in fruit or vegetables only.

Please be aware that a staff member in our class has a nut allergy.

Water bottles are encouraged.

Homework

Homework will be given Friday to Friday to develop time-management skills and provide practise of concepts. Students are encouraged to ask for help before the due date if they are finding a question difficult.

In order to participate in Golden Time students need to complete the homework tasks every week..

Reading – Read for at least 15 minutes each night, for a minimum of 4 nights a week. Students can choose their own book, or be given a levelled text upon request.

Think Mental — 3 days of mental maths. The first day is completed during class math sessions. If your child is having trouble with a problem ask them to circle the number and we will revisit it in class. After about 15-20 minutes if your child is still struggling with the Maths, draw a line under the last sum they completed and sign it. This will show us they have done their best.

Spelling - Personal word activities.

Research – To improve their research skills, Years 5 and 6 students will be given research questions to complete each week. Year 4s are welcome to have a go at these activities.

Incomplete work and class projects may also be required to be completed at home. Information on assignments will be sent home via See Saw.
