Next terms menu will include Pizza Subs with a ham, cheese and pineapple topping.

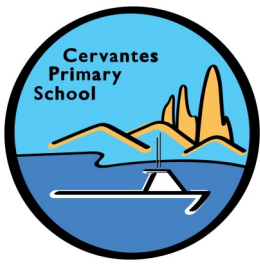
## RESIDENTIAL HORSE RIDING CAMPS – LANCELIN

## JUNIOR CLASS

Last week, the Junior Room students were busy learning all about celebrations and special days in the year. We discussed why we have these days, when they are, and what things families do to celebrate them. One way of celebrating that they found particularly interesting was fireworks! We learnt about fireworks and created our own artwork! They look so good!



## MIDDLE CLASS

This update is all about art! Students created textured flower artworks using mixed materials. They painted patterned backgrounds in shades of green, then added tissue paper petals and crumpled centres to form bold, 3D flowers. This project focused on colour, texture, and layering to bring their designs to life. Another project had the class exploring warm and cool colours and how they can show different emotions. We discussed how warm colours like red, orange, and yellow can represent feelings such as happiness, energy, and excitement, while cool colours like blue, green, and purple can show calmness, sadness, or relaxation. Using oil pastels, students practised blending colours together to create smooth transitions and new shades.



## SENIOR CLASS

The Senior Class students have been learning about the importance of bees in our ecosystem. The children worked independently or in small groups to design and create their 'Bee Hotels' out of recycled items. It is a place bees can rest and be protected whilst in the search of nectar. Some students researched what colours they would be attracted to, to assist in the painting of the hotels. It was found that some colours can affect the bee's behaviour and could potentially make them more aggressive or wary.
