

WELCOME TO CERVANTES PRIMARY SCHOOL

Cervantes Primary School is a Level 3 school in the Mid West Region with an average enrolment of 50 students over the last three years. Multi age classrooms are kept to small sizes and supported with regular Education Assistant time. Numeracy and Literacy remain a focus with many resources directed to them, ensuring an individualised approach.

Traditions at Cervantes Primary include a summer Suff Carnival, involvement in the town ANZAC service, Year 6 leadership development, Mother's Day Afternoon Tea, Father's Day Breakfast, involvement in local Arts and Craft Festival, Year 6 Graduation celebrations and the End of Year Beach Party.

STUDENT LEADERS



REWARD SYSTEM

The School celebrates good behaviour each Friday afternoon with a half hour of Golden Time where the students choose a fun activity to participate in.

We also have a faction reward system where students earn points for their team and are acknowledged at assembly.

Students are also acknowledged for showing the school values weekly.

Students who continuously demonstrate good behaviour are invited to participate in an End of Term Reward activity.

BEHAVIOUR MANAGEMENT POLICY

Each class follows a behaviour management procedure related to gaining or losing Golden Time, to reinforce the school's Behaviour Expectations and Values. During break times, students who are not demonstrating the values or rules are sent to sit out on the office veranda for 5 minute increments.



The students are provided with access to a range of teaching tools and learning opportunities through online services, including; an individual email account, access to the internet, digital resources and online learning activities. They will be asked to sign a Student ICT Usage Agreement annually.

Parents are asked to abide by our Social Media Code of Conduct to ensure our Facebook page remains a place to build upon our welcoming, informative school spirit and bring to everyone's attention the things that make our school great.

PHOTOGRAPH PERMISSION

Parents are asked to complete a Media Consent form as part of the enrolment procedure. This consent allows us to publish images of your child in newsletters, on the school website, in social media and other media. If your consent changes please notify the school immediately.

STUDENT SUPPORT

The school has access to numerous health professionals if parents and the school have concerns. Teachers or the Principal may discuss with parents a referral to the School Psychologist, Health Nurse, Speech Pathologist or Occupational Therapist.

ASSEMBLIES

Assemblies are held once a Term on a Thursday at 9.05am. The dates of assemblies are published in the newsletter and the term calendars.

Assemblies are alternately hosted by the classes. During each assembly, class items are presented and Faction Points are announced. Achievement and Value Award certificates are awarded to children for their efforts or achievements in class. All parents and friends are welcome to attend.

PARENT INFORMATION MEETING

At the beginning of each year, parent information sessions will be held for each classroom. This enables teachers to inform parents about the processes and procedures that will be in place for the year.

SHARING

While we encourage students to share their stories we discourage them bringing personal belongings to school because we would hate to see them lost or broken. If an item is brought to school for a special reason please ensure the teacher knows and can help keep it safe.

If your child wishes to share a birthday cake with the class please organise a suitable time with the teacher.

Homework 餐

It is our intention at Cervantes PS that homework is a practice and revision activity. Students of the various year levels do different amounts and types of homework. Each child is asked to read, allowing them to practice their fluency and improve their vocabulary and comprehension skills. Students begin revising their spelling skills by having sound and sight words to practice and as they get older, practice their weekly spelling words by completing simple activities. From Year 3, students are given mathematics homework that is from a level below their actual learning level, again to reinforce and practice concepts and skills previously learnt.

If your child is having any difficulties with homework, Please discuss it with the classroom teacher so a solution can be gained.

The giving and marking of homework takes a considerable amount of time, indicating the importance we believe it has. We therefore ask that students demonstrate the necessary respect and responsibility to complete the work to an appropriate level.

ATTENDANCE MATTERS

If your child is absent from School please contact the school ASAP via phone, text message (0400 350 086) or write an absent note. If your child arrives at school after 9.05am they will need to visit the office first to obtain a Late Note before going to class.

If students need to leave school during the day, please notify the school office and complete an absentee note or if they are returning the same day, retrieve a Leave Pass.

RIDING TO SCHOOL

We encourage students to walk or ride to school using the pathways in town. All students who ride, must wear a helmet.

INSURANCE POLICY

Our P&C has a world wide, 24 hr accident policy to cover all students attending Cervantes Primary School. A \$9.00 fee is payable to the P&C at the beginning of each year. This insurance covers students for accidents requiring medical attention or emergency ambulance over and above Medicare and Private Health Insurance.

INCURSIONS AND EXCURSIONS

Students will be invited to participate in various incursions and excursions throughout the year to compliment the school's learning programs.

Parents are asked to consent to students walking within the town boundaries when they first enroll their child. Teachers will inform parents if they plan to take students off school grounds. For any excursions out of town, parents will be informed and asked to complete a permission form before the day.

A small fee may be charged for incursions or excursions if the need arises.



Parents are required to complete a Student Health Care Summary when enrolling their child. If any medical details change, please inform the school immediately. If your child suffers from an ongoing medical condition, you may be required to complete additional health forms and/or a Health Care Plan.

Please follow our Healthy Food and Exercise policy; less packaged food makes a healthier lunchbox. No confectionary, packet chips or cool drink should be sent to school. These will be removed from students and returned to them at the end of the day to take home.

Students have the opportunity to have daily Crunch 'n Sip and are encouraged to bring a fruit or vegetable snack to school. We encourage students to have a water bottle in the classroom, which they can refill throughout the day.

Be on alert for head lice. Students are checked regularly and parents informed when head lice are found. If live nits are found in the child's hair, parents will be asked to collect their child as soon as possible.

We have a No Hat, No Play policy. Any student who forgets their hat will be asked to sit in the shade or play in the undercover area.

LUNCHES can be ordered on Monday and Thursday.





Parents are asked to keep their child at home if they are unwell. We would appreciate you notifying the staff if your child will be absent from school due to sickness.

Diseases such as Chicken Pox, Conjunctivitis, Diarrhoea, Measles, Glandular Fever, School Sores and Hand, Foot and Mouth all have exclusion times. Please contact the school immediately.

IMMUNISATION

Proof of immunisation must be shown when enrolling your child.

SCHOOL UNIFORM

- Plain black shorts, pants or skirt with gold top, school rugby jumper or jacket. **Please ensure all uniforms are clearly labelled.**
- School hat only to be worn (this is supplied by P&C on enrolment as we have a "No Hat No Play" policy)
- Shoes need to be worn to allow students to participate in outdoor or sport activities.
- Faction coloured t-shirts (red or blue) are to be worn only on Sport Carnival days.
- No denim is to be worn.
- No make up or nail polish to be worn
- No excessive jewellery or hair accessories.
- Longer hair to be tied up or secured off student's face.

STUDENT PICK UP

We ask that parents with students in the Junior Class pick up their children from the Kiss and Drop Zone or the classroom veranda. If a person other than a parent or guardian is picking up your child, please notify the teacher or the school office.

Car parking is limited so please take care in the area.

BUSHFIRE ZONE

Our school is on the Bushfire Zone Register, so if there is a Catastrophic warning level in Cervantes or the Shire of Dandaragan the school will be closed for the day. This decision is directed by the Director General of the Department of Education and the Emergency Services personnel. Parents will be notified the day before, if possible.
